Instructions for the Guardians

Guardians may please keep in mind that Vidyapith is a branch centre of Ramakrishna Mission, run on the principle of 'Gurukula' system as envisaged by Swami Vivekananda and is not a mere school in the ordinary sense of the term. So the parents as well as the students should follow certain norms compatible with these ideals.

1. Meeting the boys is permitted only once in a month on any **Sunday / Wednesday** between 9.30 a.m. - 12.00 noon or 4 p.m - 6 p.m. after **obtaining permission** from the Chief Warden office. The local guardians will also follow the **same rules** regarding meeting their wards. The representative of guardians may meet the boys during visiting hours with proper letter of authority.
2. Supplying of something **not prescribed** in the prospectus or not asked for by the school authority is **strictly prohibited**. Boys are NOT to be supplied with **cash**, full sleeve woolly-cot vests, inner, high-neck vests, and caps of different colours. Supplying of medicine without prescription or without the knowledge of authority is prohibited. Necessary health drinks like complan, glucose etc. will be supplied by Vidyapith only under the recommendations of the vidyapith physician.
3. To prevent losses, guardians will kindly write the name or registration number of the boy on every garment, books and other articles wherever possible.
4. **Use of Mobile phone and electronic gadgets** by the students is absolutely prohibited.
5. Guest House facility is available only after permission has been obtained well in advance. In case guardians want to take lunch in the campus they should obtain food coupon from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. and attend the first batch.
6. Students are NOT allowed to enter into the Guest House even with their guardians.
7. Guardians are requested to attend morning and evening Prayer and follow other rules and regulations of vidyapith while staying in the campus.
8. During vacations guardians should supervise their study and try to maintain an academic atmosphere at home during vacations. Family traditions should also be taught to the boys during vacations.
9. Every **unauthorized late-comer** will pay Rs. 100/- (Rupees one hundred) only per day for the period of his absence and it will be incorporated in the boy's statement of accounts.
10. Boys may have **spectacles**. During play hours they are often broken. So guardians are requested to give two pairs of spectacles. Prescription relating to the power of the eyes should also accompany the boys.
11. Please intimate immediately the change of **correspondence address**, if any, to central office.
